



Future Classroom Lab Summer Academy

Enhancing creativity and innovation in my classroom

3-7 July 2017

Description

Do schools kill or nurture creativity? Would you like your school to be a place where the students can develop skills and attitudes that combine elements such as creativity, critical thinking, collaboration, imagination and inventiveness? This course will lead the participants to reflect on how to nurture creativity in students and how to teach creatively! The participants will explore a range of (ICT) tools strategies for this, such as content creation, digital storytelling, flipped classroom, augmented reality, content curation, etc. The course is designed to enhance the joy of learning. It is aimed at teachers who want to learn how to create innovative learning content and who want to network with like-minded peers.

Learning objectives

In this course the participants will learn to:

- enhance standard educational materials with creative tools and applications
- implement the design thinking process in their teaching practices
- design their own learning materials for flipping the classroom
- create digital storytelling activities
- gamify classroom activities
- use emerging technologies (Augmented Reality, Virtual Reality, QR codes) to create activities for interdisciplinary learning
- use social media for teaching and professional development
- learn how to curate digital content.

Trainers

Bart Verswijvel is a Belgian educator who was a teacher of Dutch in a secondary school for about 30 years. 2011-2016 he worked part time at the Flemish National Support Service for eTwinning in Brussels. In March 2012 Bart Verswijvel joined European Schoolnet. As a Pedagogical Adviser he has been involved in several EUN projects like the Future Classroom Lab, iTEC, eTwinning and Living Schools Lab. He moderates several communities for teachers and he leads the network of Future Classroom ambassadors and the network of Future Classrooms. Bart Verswijvel holds a master's degree in Germanic Philology and a post graduate in E-learning and Digital Didactics. He is a co-author of several textbooks for Dutch as a mother tongue. He is an international speaker and a leader of workshops. He leads Teachmeets and Twitterchats. Bart Verswijvel was a prize winner in several competitions like eTwinning Awards and Microsoft Innovative Teachers. In 2010 he was awarded the Queen Paola Prize for Education.



Arjana Blazic teaches English and German in Zagreb, Croatia. She is education technology adviser, e-learning designer, coordinator of the Croatian Future Classroom and member of the Croatian Special Task Force for Curriculum Design. Arjana holds a Master of Education from the University of Zagreb and a Course Designer Diploma from the CARNet e-Learning Academy. She is a recipient of the 2014-2015 Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship Award at Penn State University, where she successfully completed a year-long Teaching and Learning with Technology programme. Arjana is author and founder of award-winning projects, learning platforms and online and onsite professional development training courses. She has written articles about teaching and learning with technology and an ICT book for children. She has won awards in different competitions, such a Microsoft Partners in Learning, National eTwinning Prizes, Europe @School, and Edublogs. Arjana speaks at conferences, hosts teachmeets, moderates Twitter chats and leads workshops, seminars and webinars.

It is advised to avoid areas close to the two train stations Gare du Nord and Gare du Midi, which are not so nice areas for visitors. If you have any questions e.g. regarding the hotel location, public transport connections to the course venue or similar, please let me know.

How to arrive to Brussels

Brussels has two airports: Brussels National airport (Zaventem), about 30 min to the city centre, and Brussels South airport (Charleroi), about 60 min to the city centre. You can arrive conveniently to Brussels also by train from London (Eurostar), Paris, Amsterdam and Cologne (Thalys).

From the Brussels airport (Zaventem) to the centre

- **BY BUS:**
 - The buses **Number 12** (Monday to Friday until 20h) and **Number 21** (weekends all day and weekdays after 20h) take you to **Diamant, Schuman and Luxembourg**. The ticket costs 4-6 Euros. You find the bus schedules here: <http://www.stib.be/horaires-dienstregeling.html?l=en>
 - The “**De Lijn**” **bus N° 471** provides an express bus services between the airport and the **Brussels North train station**. <https://www.delijn.be/en/lijnen/lijn/3/471/1/BUS#2>
- **BY TRAIN:** The train takes you to the **main train stations** in the Brussels city area: Gare du Nord, Gare Centrale, and Gare du Midi every 15-20 min. There is also a direct train from the airport to Schuman every 30 min. The ticket costs 8.5€. The trains leave from the Level 0 of the airport terminal: www.brusselsairport.be/en/passngr/to_from_brussels_airport/train/

From the Charleroi airport to the centre:

- Take the Brussels City Shuttle bus which takes you to the **Brussels Gare du Midi** (main train station). A return ticket costs 28 euros (and a one-way ticket normally 14 euros).

- At Gare du Midi you can continue your journey by using different metro lines, buses or pre-metro.

The courses will be organised in Brussels, at European Schoolnet's Future Classroom Lab.

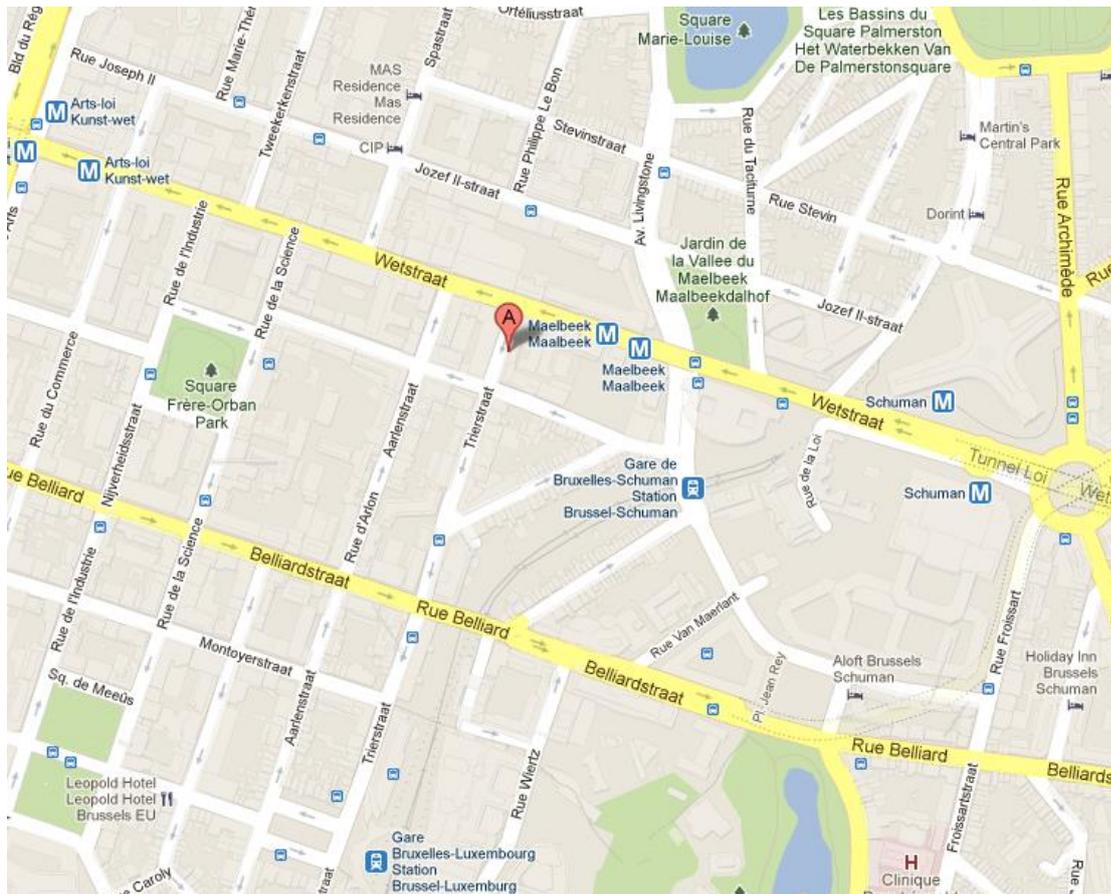

How to best reach the EUN office and Future Classroom Lab

The office is close to the following places:

- Schuman (buses, metro lines 5 & 1, train, airport bus): 10 min walk
- Luxembourg (buses, train, airport bus): 10 min walk
- Arts-Loi (metro lines 1, 2, 5, 6): 10 min walk
- Maelbeek metro station (lines 1 and 5): take the exit "Rue de la Loi", 2 min walk
- Thon EU hotel: 1 min walk (across the street)



Be aware of pick-pockets whenever you are in public places, especially when using public transports.

Insurance

We ask the course participants to confirm they have health insurance that is internationally valid during their stay in Brussels. EU citizens can obtain a free European Health Insurance Card (EHIC).

Cancellation policy

If the participant cancels his or her participation up to 6 weeks before the course begins, there are no cancellation fees. If the participation is cancelled between 6 weeks and 2 weeks before the course starts, 50% of the course fee will be charged. If they cancel any later, there will not be any refund. Substitutions are possible right up to the start of the course.
